REPORT:

The second year students were oriented about the "Manufacturing Internship" by Mr. Kulandaivelu, Nurturing Potential HR Service. The class was explained about the way of handling interns in different companies and what does the company expects from the intern students. He also shared his own experience in his career as HR. The session was very helpful as the students got an idea about the manufacturing companies expectations.

On 24th June a guest lecture was organized to provide an insight on do's and don'ts in manufacturing internship. The session started with the prayer song; welcome address followed with profile of guest speaker.

His session started with a question what is the do's and don'ts in manufacturing internship and what we as students must compulsorily learn from industry. He also mentioned some questions to be asked to the company as well as Human Resource department. He pointed some important

aspects that has to be carried out such as the code of conduct, safety measures, work timings, use of technical gadgets inside company and reading of the company manual or the book that is given by the HR. He explained all the concepts that was related to our internship using practical examples with the help of incidents that took place in company.

Then in the second half, he dealt about the "campus to corporate" where in the concept was as an HR internship student how you can proceed from your campus to corporate campus and also what is expected from HR student in the company. Then he presented a video that showed the difference between fixed mindset and growth mindset. There were lot of comparisons discussed when we have fixed and growth mindset. He also advised to be open minded in asking questions. There were certain aspects such as register updates/ books, standing orders, time office, administration, transport, canteen rules and regulations, acts that are followed in the company.

There were certain laws and acts that was discussed like model standing orders, POSH act and company story and its profile. Certain points that leads to think and act were also discussed through interaction of students. New concepts such as master of learning responsibility, conduct vs misconduct in trade unions, shop floor schemes and feedback, total employee involvement. There were lot of quotes that made us think regarding our duties and responsibilities. Some important concepts of accountability were also learnt.



Report:

Counseling is the process of building relationships with individuals that empower them to accomplish mental health and wellness, education, and career goals. It is a collaborative relationship between the counselor and their client.

The core counselling skills are described below.

- 1. Attending: Attending in counselling means being in the company of someone else and giving that person your full attention, to what they are saying or doing, valuing them as worthy individuals.
- 2. Silence: Silence in counselling gives the client control of the content, pace and objectives. This includes the counsellor *listening to silences as well as words*, sitting with them and recognising that the silences may facilitate the counselling process.
- 3. Reflecting and Paraphrasing: Reflecting in counselling is part of the 'art of listening'. It is making sure that the client knows their story is being listened to.

 This is achieved by the helper/counsellor by both repeating and feeding a shorter version of their story back to the client.
- 4. Clarifying and the Use of Questions: Questions in counselling are classed as a basic skill. The counsellor uses open questions to clarify his or her understanding of what the client is feeling. Leading questions are to be avoided as they can impair the counselling relationship.

- 5. Focusing: Focusing in counselling involves making decisions about what issues the client wants to deal with. The client may have mentioned a range of issues and problems and focusing allows the counsellor and client together to clear away some of the less important surrounding material and concentrate on the central issues of concern.
- 6. Building Rapport: Building rapport with clients in counselling is important, whatever model of counselling the counsellor is working with.

 Rapport means a sense of having a connection with the person.
- 7. Summarising: Summaries in counselling are longer paraphrases. They condense or crystallise the essence of what the client is saying and feeling. The summary 'sums up' the main themes that are emerging.

Outcome: counselling skills helps to identify the student's problem and helping the students to solve their problem on their own. So that they can come back to their normal situation and can shine in their life. The teacher requires counselling skills to help their students who are in need.







Detailed Report On the Program

The Student Panel Discussion on the Draft National Education Policy held at DG Vaishnav College, Chennai on the 14th of August, 2019 had participants from the Post Graduate courses of the college such as the MA HRM, MBA, MSW HR, M.COM, M.Sc Physics, Chemistry, Mathematics, Economics etc.

The students actively participated, shared and discussed their views on the new draft National Education Policy. The event was organized by Dr V. Sayee Kumar, Head of the department, MA-HRM Dr.T.S.Premalatha. H.O.D of Economics and Dr.Sulu Priya, H.O.D of MSW-HR.

The moderator of the panel discussion was Dr. R. Gayathri, the session started at 9.45 a.m. in the morning with various cultural events such as Group singing, Traditional dance and VilluPaatu performed by the students of the college. The Panel discussion started at 12.00pm with a brief introduction on the policy by Dr. R. Ganesan, Principal DG Vaishnav College, Chennai.

The panel discussion consisted of two rounds, the first round was initiated by the first speaker, who spoke about the negatives of the current education system and why NEP is the saviour. According to him the current system focuses only on memorizing, memory power is considered as a test of intelligence and how this leads to poor quality education and unemployment in the country. He states that every individual must be skilled with Fundamental literacy and Numerical skills. Likewise each student from the panel gave their views and perspectives on the NEP, 2019.

After the end of the first round of the session, the moderator gave her comments and answers to the questions that was discussed in the panel. She stated that the 3 language policy is new only to the government schools while many of the private schools has already been following this policy therefore execution of the policy is not hard. She also spoke about the schools in Kashmir where the number of children studying are very less. There are about 14,000 schools that has got very less students enrolled. Recently 7 years back, Kashmir schools adopted the mid-day meal policy and the literacy rate increased to 63%. And finally she spoke about how the 30:1 ratio policy is for the

government schools as the students in government schools are 60 or more per class with just one teacher which is very high.

The second round of the Panel Discussion focused on the key areas of the NEP that plans on introducing massive changes in the framework of education and structure of the educational institutions. The deliberation revolved around the feasibility of the measures mentioned in the draft.

The first speaker spoke about the concept of pooling of resources. The school complex system, by which two schools pool their space and teachers for the common benefit of the children. Clubbing of school premises can be beneficial in terms of increasing space for playground. All facilities are available and accessible to everyone. Equity and equality can be ensured.

Moderator highlighted the stress on Teachers development by merging B. Ed college merged with University is most welcome. Educational audit, performance appraisal for teachers are about to be implemented. Promotion and pay based on performance system will come into force in schools and colleges.

Each district will have at least one University with all courses. Tribal education would be in the ratio of 25:1. There is scarcity of teachers in tribal communities. There is a plan to develop and recruit teachers from the same community so that there is no problem of shifting families and who those transportation for teachers are placed in areas from elsewhere. The board exams for classes 3, 5, 8 are aimed to act as a measure of census to be taken to assess the quality of students aimed to correct weaknesses and to know the strengths of the students. Vocational training will be given from 6th Std. From classes 9-12, there will be 8 semesters, 48 subjects. Proficiency test will be conducted by school. As a result of these measures, dropouts will decrease. Counselling system is to be implemented, door to door. Schools have to prepare reports for the same. 20,000 crores will be allotted to establish Research Institute in the country.

Outcome of the Event

The discussion came to a conclusion by quoting the concerns discovered in the New Education Policy and the possible bottlenecks that are likely to come up in its implementation. Some of the Cons are-

- It was said that it is impossible to compare any country with India. Setting up of national
 institutions which take care of different aspects of education, may put pressure on
 government.
- NEP might affect Higher Education Commission. Bringing all sectors under one umbrella might bring confusion.
- RTE will be amended to age of 3. IQ levels vary and starting school early might be difficult for students.
- It's not possible to allot large funds for education given the limited profits and budgets.
- Focus only on primary/ school education. No mention of maintenance or improvement of hygiene.
- Policy fails to mention the rich and poor divide in India. Everyone should have equal education at all levels. Minimum standard set for schools to be followed.
- No mention of children with disabilities
- Emphasis is less on tribal education.

The Pros of the policy were summarized to be-

- B. Ed made 4 year integrated program is an enriching step.
- The Policy inculcates programs to improve teaching. Teachers have to be more equipped, old teaching modules are becoming obsolete. Continuous development is necessary. Tests, interviews and demonstrations involved in teachers' selection.
- Multi-disciplinary majors- importance given to research.
- 5% of population is equipped with Vocational education. NEP wants no collar workforce, emphasis placed on vocational education.
- National Research Foundation- the policy focuses on Research.
- Multiple entry and exit points at University level. Students who quit in the completion of first
 year get a diploma, if they quit in the second year they get ad advanced diploma and those who
 complete the entire program get a degree. This step enables students to switch courses if they
 discover they have interest in some other course/discipline.

- Liberal education is an extremely good step- test for critical thinking abilities. Industry institution collaboration is appreciable.
- After the conclusion of the session, the moderator and the audience engaged in the Q&A session. The best question was selected and a prize given to the student and certificates were distributed for participants of the panel discussion.



This course was created with a specific intention to make students think critically and analyze the society that they live in. Using the platform, students will be able to create real change on the ground and become active participants in our democracy.

It gives the students to understand about the governance and the right way to approach the officials in order to address the civic advocacy. It creates an online platform augmented by comprehensive database of past and present elected representatives and candidates belonging to all three wings of government – the legislature, executive and the judiciary. With features to provide a safe space for users to express their views, tools to manage such interaction and a comprehensive analysis engine,

this is expected to impact voter behaviour, help representatives understand the needs of their constituency better and bring openness in the conduct of governance.

Activity carried out:

The students were divided into 8 groups, each group has a moderator, given each group a handout on a different governance topic and ask them to discuss. Two members of each group have presented their conclusions at the end of the discussion and answer questions from their peers. The next session starts with the history of voting, introduction of democracy as a concept: this activity brought the insights of democracy and the relation to accountability of the citizen to cast a vote and show the participation together. Personal thinking activity introduces low voter turnout concept where the analysis done by the students on why they believe young people are not voting to give one reason off the list and write the reasons on the board through this a holistic report where made for discussion.

Activity related to brainstorming and Introduction about RTI (Right To Information) and its salient features through Group Discussion. On discussion - RTI process, rules and Cases. In addition to this the fundamental rights and duties were asked to list out provided the moderator lists it.

Outcome of the program/ event

The discussions and presentation on the six fundamental freedoms with a focus on the freedom of speech and expression, contrasting governments with no such system have been discussed with various interpretations of the students.

They were provided with a range of topics and asked to express their thoughts and opinions on the same. The student addresses the stereotypes they have heard about themselves on any religion on

a piece of paper and discussed randomly to recount of religious / caste disputes across the country since independence.




The session gave us the insight on interview skills and how to attend the interview with clear ideas and view. He also gave us the tips that have to be followed during the interview.

Detailed Report of the Programme: (500 Words)

The Department of Social Work, D G Vaishnav College organized the Rural Camp for the I MSW students as part of the curriculum. The Rural Camp named 'Thulir 2019' was conducted at Kothagiri Taluk, Nilgiris District from 24.09.2019 to 01.10.2019 in collaboration with an NGO – Nilgiris Adivasi Welfare Association (NAWA). The villages that were visited by the students were New Kothagiri, Bavayur, Mettukal, Kunjapanai, Sundapati, Banagudi, Vellarikombai and Anilkadu where they had an interaction with four tribal communities namely, Irulas, Kurumbas and Kotas.

The inauguration programme of the Rural Camp of team Thulir in association with NAWA was held at New Kothagiri. During this week long rural camp various activities were conducted for the students in order to enable the students to understand the socio-economic and cultural conditions of tribal life and engage in the conduct of programmes that would develop the knowledge attitude and skills of social work. Accordingly, they learnt about the livelihood, culture and uniqueness of Tribes in the Nilgiris district through socio-economic surveys and informal interaction, created awareness on combating social issues and indulging in related affirmative action such as Afforestation, Prevention of Alcohol Abuse, Prevention of Child Abuse, Prevention of Child Marriage and Promotion of Child Education through street theatre, mime, skits etc.

The students also conducted medical camps, engaged in school cleaning and wall painting, conducted sports competitions for tribal school children and organized cultural programmes for the people of the surrounding villages. The students learnt the skills of Participatory Rural Appraisal and also organized a cricket tournament for the tribal youth of the district. The students collected a host of sponsorship items during the pre-camp phase such as buckets, mugs, bed sheets, soaps, biscuits, incense sticks, tooth brushes, tooth pastes, hair oil, shampoo, note books, pens, pencils, school bags, plates, water bottles etc. The collected items from various donors were handed over to the tribal people of various villages visited by the team Thulir.

The camp came to an end with a valedictory programme that was held at the office of the partnership NGO - Nilgiris Adivasi Welfare Association (NAWA).

2. Outcomes of the Programme/ Event:

- The students learnt the socio-economic and cultural conditions of tribal life
- The students learnt to integrate into practice certain essential values for life like simple living, adjusting with minimum facilities and putting into practice the concept of dignity of labour and self-discipline
- The students gained an exposure by working with tribal communities, specifically with underprivileged groups of children, women, youth group and senior citizens
- The students learnt to work together as a team with a positive approach

• The students developed suitable skills for social work practice such as planning, organizing, executing, co-coordinating, recording and report writing



In 2003, she initiated prevention activities through awareness programmes and screening camps. At present she heads the TANKER Awareness and Prevention Programme. Her vision is to prevent chronic kidney diseases at all levels in the society.

The session started with a short objective test about the awareness on Renal problems and diseases. Based on the test, the resource person commenced with the explanation about kidneys and its functions including maintaining water balance, salt balance, sodium and potassium; regulating blood pressure and removal of waste products of body metabolism. The functions of the kidneys were explained with the cross section diagram of kidney and nephrons. The session also taught about the symptoms of kidney diseases such as presence of glucose and protein in urine, blood in urine, repeated urinary infection, etc. The resource person also elaborated about the treatments available for renal diseases such as Hemodialysis, Peritoneal dialysis and kidney transplantation.

Moreover the session instructed the students about various renal diseases and the practices that has to done for the prevention of such renal diseases. The session was very interactive and resourceful

for the students to clarify their doubt regarding the topic and on the intake of water and excretion of human body.







Outcome of the program:



TQM is a management philosophy, a continuous improvement approach to business, through a comprehensive management system, which Provides value to the organisation and customers. Driven by continuous improvement in all operations. Focuses on customers - Internal or External. Treating suppliers as partners. Views organization as one integral system not as individual departments. Emphasizes quality and teamwork among all employees

Quality systems and activities have cost implications:

- Prevention costs Cost of planning and implementing a quality system

REPORT:

The outreach program was part of social work forum SWASTI, Social work association for students' transformation and Innovation. The objective of the program was to acknowledge the work of sanitary and metro workers and their contribution to the society. The social work students choose the community of Arumbakkam area, and the metro and sanitary workers were approached and consulted on their needs. The students with the help of the zonal officer and health officer of zone 8 had organized the program in harrington community hall. The students also collected sponsorship of amount over 15,000 through Yathum Kovai (NGO) and also various institutions. The amount was used to provide them with sanitary kit. The students had also provided the workers with free medical camp through Appasamy hospitals. The chief guests for the awareness program were Mr. Vijay Kumar- sanitary Officer (Zone 8), Mr. Dinesh-Founder of Yathum Kovai (NGO) and Mrs. Ester Mariaselvam-project head of Action aid (NGO). Since Mrs. Ester could not attend the program, the project coordinators of action aid Vijliya and Sathyan attended the program on her behalf. The program's main objective is to provide awareness on the importance of sanitation and also acknowledge the work of sanitary and metro workers. The medical camp was provided by Appasamy hospitals, the panel of doctors includes dermatologist. The medical camp was organized for around 200 workers.

Outcomes of the program

The program was successful in providing them with sanitary kit which included the 34 metal scoopers, 17 metal scrappers and 60 liters of sanitary liquid. The program also helped in providing them with skin related consultancy. The program helped in acknowledging the importance of sanitation and it's uses and also helped in spreading awareness on worker rights

and unions. The program also served as a medium to connect the government officials to workers and NGO's. The major success is that the student reached the most marginalized, discriminated community who were overlooked for too long.



Detailed report of the program:

Ms. Madhumitha Gomathinayagam- HR Manager in Avacend solutions pvt. Ltd shared her views on inclusion and diversity of LGBTQI community. she said that inclusion should start from educational institutions rather than starting from workplaces she shared that it's better not to label them and include them. It's unfair to question about others sexual orientation and sexual affairs it basically violates the privacy of an individual which is also a constitutional right of any Indian citizen. She explained that there should be a diversified environment in organisations. There should be no discrimination based on gender. In her personal life she felt that her grandparents were more inclusive than today's generation. She also shared that if inclusion should be imparted in an organisation that it should start from the top management levels. Just stating inclusion in policies would not bring change in the minds of individuals of an organisation.

Ms.Nila, founder of Pharm foundation - had shared her life experiences as a transwoman through a video explaining her life history through different transitions. Since her childhood she had faced bullying, teasing in school which made her feel insecure. when she was employed in a BPO Company she was fired without any proper reason. She was not employed which lead her to beg for food. She felt more disgraced and embarassed by the way the society labelled her. Her family accepting her as a transwoman was her biggest support which gave her the motivation to study and serve for the trangender community. After which she worked as a mentor for AIDS control. She concluded her speech by conveying the message that Inclusion of LGBTQI community in the educational system is the best way to pave way for social inclusion and diversity.

Mr. Jabez Kelly- Director of Quents, had gave explanation to understand the meaning and concept of each community of LGBTIQ. Then he continued with asking students about the ways to which inclusion can be brought in educational institutions for LGBTIQ community people. Then Mr. Jabez continued to speak on various mental issues that these people go through in their life. Social

trust is one which people often rely on to share their life experiences with others. Micro aggression is another concept where people in situations would me too sensitive to the circumstances which happen before them. Such micro aggressions are seen more in people belonging to LGBTQI community. Which is not a good sign. So, an environment with no restrictions and stereotypes should be made available for the people belonging to the LGBTQI community to make them feel more welcome. Serious measures should be taken in inclusion of LGBTQI community in all forms of educational institutions and organizations such as peer counselingcenters, gender-neutral toilets, etc.. Followed by that the Annual Report of SWASTI was read by Ms. Pooja, Vice- President of SWASTI. Then Prof. Ramesh, Faculty Coordinator of SWASTI gave the valedictory address. Further Price distribution Ceremony for the best Outreach team was carried out in which Awareness and Medical Camp for Sanitary Workers and Income generation Program were honoured with the prices. Apart from this best performer were also awarded. The Chief Guest gave honoured the winners with the gift. As the end of the valedictory ceremony the Vote of thanks was proposed by Ms. Shirali, Treasure of SWASI. The Program ended withthe National Anthem.

Outcome of the program:

- 1) The students had clearly understood the various sections of LGBTQI community;
- 2) The students understood the mental issues, depression, discrimination they face in the society.
