#### **B.A.ENGLISH DEPARTMENT ACTIVITES 2019-2020**

### 1. Report on Art of Editing:

The Department of English Literature conducted a workshop for the final year undergraduate students titled 'The Art of Editing' on the 13<sup>th</sup> of July 2019. The aim of the workshop was to promote better understanding of editing and the operation that takes place in the news media. The resource person for the workshop was Ms. Keerthana , Assistant Editor / Special Correspondent ,'The Hindu'. The speaker was introduced by the head of the department, Ms. M. Jayalakshmi .

The workshop chiefly focused on sub-editing and the role of a sub-editor in print media. Through various videos and a PowerPoint presentations the resource person highlighted the significance of reporters and sub-editors in print media. The students were also asked to produce a report on a subject they were interested in. The speaker engaged in lively interaction and also occupied the students with various activities involving editing. After the activities, the speaker, Ms. Keerthana took questions from the students. The feedback from the students was positive.





#### 2. Lecture on Literature:

The Department of English Literature conducted a lecture on literature on the 1<sup>st</sup> of August 2019 for the final year undergraduate students and thefirst-yearpostgraduate students. The aim of the workshop was to promote better understanding of literature and its influence. The resource person for the lecture was Christine Berberich, Senior Lecturer- University of Portsmouth, UK. The resource person was introduced to the students by Mr. Muraliganam, Head, and Department of English Literature and felicitated by Ms. M. Jayalakshmi, Head, and Department of English Literature.

The lecture focused on the importance of reading. She spoke on how politics impacts the fiction of that particular period. She discussed how few classics monopolized literature and how it reflected on popular literature. She emphasized on the different perspectives of critics and general readers on classics and other forms of literature. She expressed her view that classics are not the only form of literature and that students should explore different forms of

writing that are now developing in literature. She ended the session by answering questions from the audience. The lecture was well received and appreciated by the students.





## 3. Workshop On Reporting:

The Department of English Literature conducted a workshop on reporting on the 10th of August 2019 for the final year undergraduate students. This was the second session of the workshop on the 'Basics of Journalism'. The aim of the workshop was to promote better understanding about reporting and the operation that takes place in the print media. The resource person for the workshop was Ms. Keerthana, Assistant Editor/ Special Correspondent, 'The Hindu'.

The workshop chiefly focused on reporting in print media. Through various PowerPoint presentations, the students were educated about the significance of reporters in print media. The students were given various activities involving reporting. The speaker engaged in lively interactions with the students and explained about the tasks that reporters undertake in their work environment. At the end of the session, Ms. Keerthana was open for questions from the students. The students were also made to submit a report at the end of the class.
