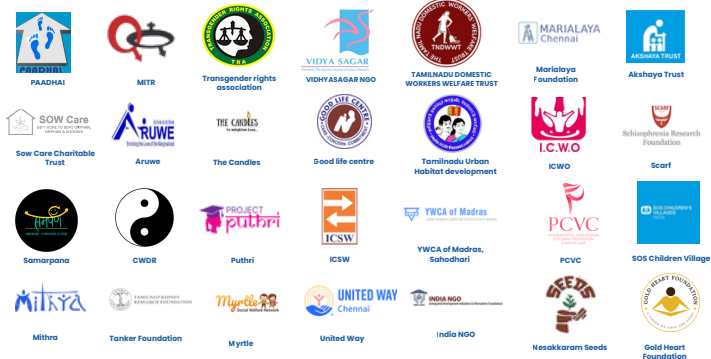
SWASTI - Student Forum
